

ABOUT NANTUCKET

Only 26 miles south of Cape Cod, Nantucket covers approximately 50 square miles, including bogs, salt marshes, beaches, sand dunes, forests, fields, moors, and ponds. You can take a ferry or an airplane from Boston or Cape Cod and, in just minutes, find yourself strolling along the cobblestone-paved streets of the downtown Historic District overflowing with art galleries, boutiques, restaurants, bookstores, museums, libraries, and more. The summer months afford guests a slew of outdoor activities including biking, hiking, sunbathing, beachcombing, swimming, fishing, boating, shopping—or gazing at the stars that guided the whaling ships of two hundred years ago. Immerse yourself in the inexhaustibly rich world of Nantucket.



Course fees include cost of accommodation in housing facilities on Nantucket (unless otherwise noted). Fees do not include meals, books or transportation to and from Nantucket.

In order to avoid any travel conflicts, you should arrive on island one day before your first class and depart one day after the last one.

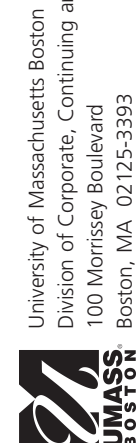

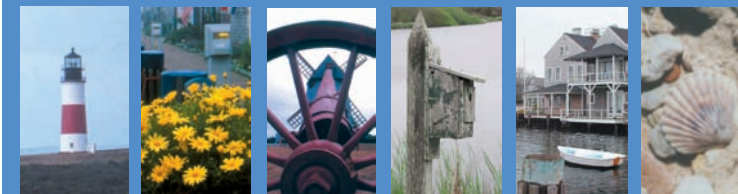

PLEIN-AIR PAINTING ON NANTUCKET

Nantucket Light 07 will be an intensive, in-depth painting experience that will use the Plein Air painting approach as a jumping-off point to the summer landscape. MARINE AND COASTAL ECOLOGICAL RESEARCH

Supervised research on the adaptations and interactions of organisms of the beaches, salt marshes, sand dunes, and embayments of Nantucket. Meets every weekday during two weeks of the summer at the University's Field Station on Nantucket. In addition to learning the ecology of Nantucket's fascinating marine and coastal habitats, this course will give students experience in field research, experimental design, data analysis, and research presentation.
